

A bronze ewer with hinged lid and moulded feet dating from the early 7th century was found in a gravel pit near Wheathampstead House in 1884 together with other evidence of a burial site. It was acquired by the British Museum in 1900.

The ewer is thought to have originated from the eastern Mediterranean and as recently as 2010 has been on loan to a German museum for an exhibition "Byzantium: Splendour and Daily Life".

A Saxon palm-cup, broken into fragments, was recovered from the gravel pit at about the same time.
