WHEATHAMPSTEAD AIR DISPLAY

(With the kind permission of the Hertfordshire Flying Club, and the friendly assistance of the De Havilland Flying School)

10.00 a.m. AIR RALLY. The machines participating will try and time their arrival from their various starting points in such a manner that they will fly over a given mark at the Air Display Field at ten o'clock. The pilot who crosses the line nearest to the above time will be adjudged the winner.

AEROBATICS. A demonstration will be given of what is popularly known as "stunt flying".

BOMBING "SIR HERBERT". A machine endeavours to bomb a moving motor car. *N.B. It will be seen that the bombs are not of a very destructive nature.*

BALLOON BURSTING. Balloons will be released from the ground and attempts will be made to tilt at them and burst them in the air.

"SIX GUN BILL". One of the world's most famous revolver shots will shoot from the machine at bottles arranged on the ground against a suitable background. His accuracy is such that he has seldom been known to fail.

SURPRISE ITEM. This display is at the time of going to print still a mystery to the organisers of this display. The veil will be lifted on Monday.

AIR RACE. The start will be a Flying Start (in every sense of the word), and the race will be one of three laps over a triangular course.

Spectators, who may desire to take a closer interest in flying, either as learners, passengers or onlookers will be welcomed on any day or at any time in the new public enclosure at the De Havilland Flying School, Hatfield.
